

Preschool English Teaching Plan

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Teaching English to preschool children requires a playful, interactive, and visually engaging approach. Young learners learn best through songs, games, movements, and repetition. The lessons should be short (20–30 minutes), with a focus on vocabulary development, listening, and speaking, rather than grammar. This document provides a one-month curriculum with three lessons per week designed for preschool learners.

Required Materials:

- Textbooks: *Oxford First Friends 1*, *Cambridge Super Safari 1*
- Flashcards (colors, animals, family, body parts)
- Audio-visual resources (songs, stories, short videos)
- Art supplies (colored pencils, paper, crayons)
- Toys or puppets for interactive activities

Day	Topic	Activities
Day 1	Colors & Numbers (1–5)	Hello song, Flashcards, Coloring game, Counting fingers
Day 2	Animals (cat, dog, bird, fish, rabbit)	Animal sounds game, Matching, Short story
Day 3	Family & Body Parts	Family vocab, 'Head, Shoulders, Knees, Toes' song, TPR activity

Curriculum Progression:

- Week 2: Expand numbers up to 10, introduce farm animals (cow, sheep, horse)
- Week 3: Add more family words (grandma, grandpa), introduce colors orange and purple
- Week 4: Review all topics with games, songs, and a mini performance by students

Teaching Tips:

- Use songs like 'Super Simple Songs' and 'If You're Happy and You Know It' for fun repetition.
- Incorporate movement and actions to help children remember vocabulary (Total Physical Response).
- Repeat key vocabulary across multiple lessons to reinforce learning.
- Praise children often to keep them motivated.
- Use visuals and toys to make lessons lively and interactive.
